Keep the city that welcomes you clean

Use the waste bins, the containers and the other services that Málaga makes available to you.





Be respectful of heritage

Be careful around historical buildings and other historical or artistic landmarks. Do not leave your mark on the heritage the city has enjoyed for so many centuries. 2

Do not drink alcohol or attract attention while on the street

It is forbidden to drink alcohol on the street. There are no excuses for disrupting scene – not the fine weather, not the excitement of having fun.





Pavements are for pedestrians

If you choose to ride a scooter – remember they can carry just one person – or a bike, use lanes designated in local ordinances.

Bear in mind that local residents have their own shopping and resting hours, which should not be disrupted. Also, be careful with noise pollution.



If you are staying for the night...

Avoid party-going or noise-making if you think you may disturb the neighbours in your building or street. Seniors, sick people, students, children, workers... they all need a few hours of rest every day.
